Following their group stage win, the girls also progressed onto the Sheffield League Finals, which were kindly hosted at Sheffield United's training ground as well. The girls event was run slightly differently to the boys, with the top 12 schools across Sheffield competing in four separate groups initially. The winners of each group would then go into a 'Champions Cup' group, followed by a 'Silver Cup' for those in 2nd place and a 'Bronze Cup' for those teams who finished in 3rd place. First up for the girls was Beck and they started well, with a few early chances. Following some brilliant passing, Winnie managed to run clear and score taking a 1-0 lead. However, Beck quickly equalised and the final few minutes were quite nervy with chances for both teams but ultimately finishing 1-1. Next up was Deepcar and the girls were fantastic! Goals from Syd and Ava meant they finished 2-0 winners and took them through to the Champions Cup! The girls were then up against 3 of the best teams in Sheffield and they were extremely strong teams. First the girls played Brunswick and some brilliant passing and movement from the opposition meant we



were quickly 4-0 down but the girls managed to stem the tide and the game finished without any more goals. Next up were the eventual winners from Ecclesall who were a very strong team with a number of academy players and again the game finished 4-0. However, showing some real determination, the girls went into the final game with the same enthusiasm and the game finished 1-1 with our goal scored by Izzy. This meant the girls finished as the 4th best team in Sheffield – a fantastic achievement and I'm very proud of all them for their efforts.
